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Groundbreaking Ceremony Held for Daniel Payne Legacy Village Proposed Faith-Based Community in Birmingham is One Step Closer to Becoming a Reality

March 7, Birmingham – Under a blanket of blue skies on the clear cool morning of Saturday, February 19 - a monumental first step was made toward transforming the vision of Daniel Payne Legacy Village into an exciting reality. Heralded by the sound of applause, a handful of shovel-wielding supporters broke ground at the site of the future faith-based mixed-use development located in North Birmingham. Hosted by the African Methodist Episcopal Church (AMEC) and symbolically scheduled during a weekend celebrating the Church's founding, AMEC representatives led the much-anticipated groundbreaking ceremony in prayer and song under the theme of "Sharing the Vision". In attendance at the event were Alabama Senator Linda F. Coleman, Administrative Assistant to Mayor William A. Bell – Charles Long, Birmingham City Council Members Roderick Royal and Steven T. Hoyt, Neighborhood Association President Ellen Spencer, and Atlanta, GA-based project developer, Tony Pourhassan.

Already touting the credo "Built on a foundation of faith, hope and prayer" Daniel Payne Legacy Village will revitalize the former site of Daniel Payne College, which has stood virtually dormant since the school closed its doors in 1979. Nestled on 153 breathtaking acres of Southern Pine trees, rolling hills and lush wetlands, the property has remained in the AME Church's hands ever since the school's closure as they sought the best possible use for the land. The original concept of local church leader Bishop James Levert Davis and owner of TyCam Development Tony Pourhassan – plans for The Daniel Payne Legacy Village include a community comprised of a beautiful church retreat complete with lodging and conference facilities at the development's core. Recreational space, more than 50 acres of green space providing beautiful park-like surroundings, and a bungalow residential neighborhood of nearly 120+ single-family homes will encircle the retreat. Handsomely constructed office space and a retail center will serve as the face of the Village along Daniel Payne Road, making this a truly innovative "Live, Work, Play, Pray" community.

"This is one of the most awe-inspiring projects I've ever had the pleasure of being a part of," insists Pourhassan. "Having designed and constructed award-winning family-centered developments in the past, it is truly inspirational when you consider the impact a development like Daniel Payne Legacy Village could have on the entire North Birmingham community. While it, too, will be family-centered – by blending a mixed-use concept with an entirely new faith-based model, it brings new meaning to the word 'groundbreaking.' Bishop Davis, the AMEC Elders, and their congregations are leading the way to a better and brighter future for the notion of a neighborhood."

It was apparent that the feeling of community was already alive and well at the building site on the morning of the groundbreaking ceremony. Proponents for the \$24 million project look forward to beginning construction of Daniel Payne Legacy Village in Spring 2011.
